

## LOCATIONS

The Glasgow School of Art is centrally located in Glasgow primarily around the Garnethill area, across several distinct buildings. The topographical streetscape of Garnethill includes steep hills and gradients which connect the GSA buildings. Accessibility can be challenging, please check in advance of arrival if travelling between our buildings/facilities meets your needs, and adjustments can possibly be made accordingly.

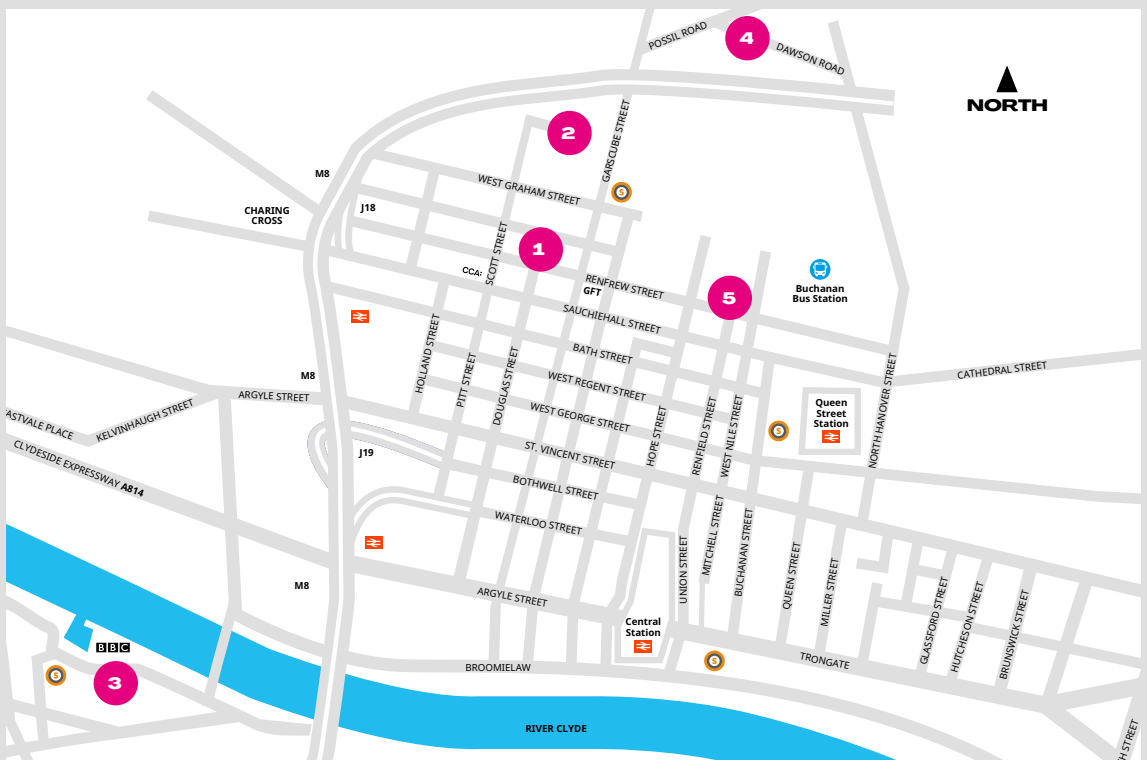

## LOCATIONS

### **TRAVELLING TO THE GARNETHILL CAMPUS**

The Garnethill Campus is approximately 20 minutes walk from Glasgow's Central and Queen Street mainline railway stations. The nearest local railway station is Charing Cross and the nearest subway station is Cowcaddens. The School is easily accessed from all major approach roads, including the M8 motorway, and only 20 minutes by bus or taxi from Glasgow International Airport.

As the campus is centrally located, with good public transport links, individuals are generally discouraged from bringing their cars to the GSA. Car parking in the streets surrounding the GSA is subject to a voucher system operated by the City Council (from 8am to 10pm every day). Vouchers may be purchased at local participating shops. The nearest public car parks are located at Cambridge Street, Concert Square (next to Buchanan Bus Station), Dundasvale (next to Stewart Street Police Station) or Sauchiehall Street (access via Bath Street). All these public car parks contain accessible parking spaces.

### **SCHOOL OF INNOVATION AND TECHNOLOGY**

Some programmes within the School of Innovation and Technology are taught in the Hub Building located at Pacific Quay, Glasgow Digital Media Quarter.

If you are driving using the M8 motorway, take junction 24 and follow the street signs to the Glasgow Science Centre. The Hub is located next door.

There is a bus stop directly outside the School of Innovation and Technology building and transport to and from the main campus area is available by bus and train. Disabled parking bays are also available directly outside the building and can be used by Blue Badge holders.

## ACCESSIBILITY

### **GARNETHILL CAMPUS**

The Garnethill Campus sits on a very steep hill. People with mobility needs may require assistance and are advised to contact the School prior to arrival +44(0) 141 353 4500 [reception@gsa.ac.uk](mailto:reception@gsa.ac.uk).

We regret that wheelchair access to some areas within some of our buildings is restricted and that some areas within the School's buildings are inaccessible to those who are unable to manage stairs. We are constantly improving access and will provide assistance where required. Accessible facilities are available in several buildings (Reid, Bourdon, Stow), including passenger and platform lifts and kerbs which have been lowered in the streets surrounding the School. Parking restrictions are in operation in the Garnethill area and the School does not have parking available for visitors.

### **SCHOOL OF INNOVATION AND TECHNOLOGY**

#### **Pacific Quay**

The Hub has been designed to ensure that all facilities are accessible for wheelchair users. Staff can be made available should assistance be required and visitor parking is available.

At The Glasgow School of Art, teaching areas can be accessed by either lift or stair lift, except for Bourdon Ground Floor Lecture Theatre, mid sections within Haldane and some areas within the Barnes building. Entrances to some buildings have automatic doors and ramps, however there are buildings that still require accessibility adjustments. Accessible toilet facilities are available in all the main teaching and service buildings on campus.

### **SUPPORT FOR THE DEAF AND THE HARD OF HEARING**

Some lecture/teaching areas, all reception areas and the Library within The Glasgow School of Art campus have a hearing loop system. Please check in advance of arrival if our current facilities meet your needs and adjustments can possibly be made accordingly.
