Through UCAS: All undergraduate applicants (except Study Abroad & Exchange) should apply online at ucas.com using GSA's institutional code **G43**. The deadline for applications is 30 June, although we advise all students to apply by 15 January.

Direct: For Postgraduate, Study Abroad and Exchange programmes, we accept direct applications. Direct applications are completed using our online application forms found on our website.

Visas, work & health

- Students from Norway coming to study in the UK will need to apply for prior Entry Clearance (a Student Visa for programmes over six months) before travelling to the UK.
- The UKVI may require you to show evidence of £1,015 per month for living expenses at the time of your visa application.
- Students with the correct stamp in their passports are able to work for up to 20 hours a week during semesters and full time in vacations.
- Students coming for programmes of study of under six months may apply for a Short Term Study Visa.
- Students may not work with a Short Term Study Visa or extend their stay.
- When making an application for a Student Visa, a fee will be levied to cover access to the National Health Service (NHS).

(New International Students) 2020/21

Undergraduate Students

- Full-degree/International Foundation programmes: £18,960 per year.*
- Study Abroad students £16,440 for full year, or £8,220 for a semester.

Postgraduate Students

- Most one-year Masters programmes £19,980.
- MSc Medical Visualisation & Human Anatomy £29,340.
- Two-year taught Masters programmes £19,980 per year.*
- Research Degrees £18,000 per year.*
- Postgraduate Certificate in Learning and Teaching/Supervisory Practice £6,660

Entry requirements

English Language Requirements

Students who have studied English at Upper Secondary level to at least year 10 and have obtained grade 4 or above in both written and spoken English in the Vitnemal fra den Videregaende Skole. Students who are not EEA citizens, or who do not have the above grades will need to provide evidence of English language ability. Check our website for a list of approved tests: www.gsa.ac.uk/international

Academic Requirements

Undergraduate: Students would be expected to have obtained average marks of four or above in their Vitnemal fra den Videregaende Skole. Students with an International Baccalaureate will need 30 points for entry to most programmes.

Postgraduate: Candidates must obtain a minimum C grade in the new Bachelor degree system.
